Based in Valencia, Spain, the association promotes cultural and academic activities that highlight the importance of the Grail and its journey through Europe.

Objectives of the Association

- To preserve and disseminate the tangible and intangible heritage linked to the history and legends of the Holy Grail.
- To promote sustainable tourism and cultural development in the regions through which the route passes.
- Promote intercultural dialogue and peace through the common European heritage.

International Collaboration Network:

The Association collaborates with various institutions and organisations in Europe to strengthen and promote the Way of the Holy Grail. These collaborations include agreements with municipalities, museums, universities and cultural organisations, all united in the mission to enhance the value of this historic route.

Presentation

The Way of the Holy Grail, Route of Knowledge, path of Peace is a cultural route that connects various historical and spiritual sites in Europe, following the route of the Holy Grail from Jerusalem to the Cathedral of Valencia. This way, in addition to offering a pilgrimage experience, promotes historical knowledge of Europe's heritage and intercultural dialogue along its entire route.

The Route

The Way of the Holy Grail crosses important historical and religious sites that have played a key role in the history of the 'quest for the Grail'. But it also recalls the memory of the historical figures who, over the centuries, have guarded it through the pages of European literature. From Jerusalem, through Rome and Naples, to France and finally to Spain, this route is full of symbolism and cultural heritage.

- **Start in Jerusalem:** Starting point, where, according to tradition, the Holy Grail was used by Jesus during the Last Supper.
- **Rome and Naples:** The upper cup is found in the catacombs of Rome... and its imprint is reflected in the decoration of the Maschio Angioino.
- **France:** In France, Mary Magdalene and other disciples of Jesus are believed to have carried the Grail, leaving a trail of churches and places of worship.
- **Spain:** The route culminates in Valencia, where the Holy Chalice is housed in Valencia Cathedral.

Meaning of the Symbol

The logo of the Way of the Holy Grail is designed with a red chalice, representing the Holy Chalice of Valencia Cathedral. The curved arms evoke an embrace, symbolising the welcome and hospitality of the Way. The base of the chalice suggests a route, highlighting the connection between the different sacred sites that form part of the itinerary.



Objectives of the Way

- **Cultural Promotion:** To promote knowledge and appreciation of the historical and religious sites linked to the Holy Grail and the history of its characters.
- **Sustainable Tourism:** To encourage responsible tourism that respects and preserves the cultural heritage. We cover most of the route on foot, by bike or on horseback.
- **Intercultural Dialogue:** Facilitating cultural exchange between the various regions and communities along the route is our priority.
